

Toi Koru **OPENS 18 MARCH**

Toi Koru presents the first major survey exhibition of paintings by the Māori master of colour and kōwhaiwhai, Dr Sandy Adsett.

Featuring sixty paintings created over six decades, Toi Koru tracks the trajectory of Dr Adsett's painting practice from the late 1960s to today. The exhibition features artworks from major public collections, including the National Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa and Auckland Art Gallery Toi o Tamaki, as well as a new series of paintings created especially for the exhibition.

Dr Adsett is among our best-kept secrets, yet still recognised as one of the most significant and respected Māori artists of his generation.
